Childcare

Children with Special Healthcare Needs



If your child has special healthcare needs or a disability, you will want a childcare provider who has experience and the skills to care for your child. The provider may need to adapt activities so that your child can participate and be successful. Most of all, it is important to find a provider who will work with you to meet the needs of your child in a safe and enriching environment.

Finding childcare is a challenge for any parent or caregiver. You may need help and support as you look for the right person or place. Look to the people around you to learn about options. You never know who may be willing to help. Talk with your child's Early Intervention provider to learn about possible resources. Speak with other parents as they may know of a childcare center or person who has experience caring for children with special needs. With help from others, you will find the person who will provide the quality care you want and need for your child.

When you start your search for a childcare provider, plan to visit the childcare program. Talk to the provider about their experience and training in caring for children with special needs. Ask about the ratio of children to adults and be sure to get references!

Once you find a provider, it is important to share information about your child's needs. You may want to create a Care Notebook, binder or a document with information about your child. Include information about your child's physical and medical needs as well as information about their favorite activities and how they communicate. There are many tools and resources available to create a Care Notebook.

Family TIES of Massachusetts provides information, referral, and parent to parent support for families of children with special health needs or disability and their professional partners. We also provide information about Early Intervention (EI) and maintain a complete list of EI Programs in Massachusetts.
